### “Pentecost”

“And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit.” (Acts 2:1 & 4). Pentecost is the fulfillment of the promise of Jesus after his ascension, he would send the Holy Spirit. Many biblical students claim that Pentecost is the birthday of the N.T. Church. For over 2,000 plus years the church has ministered the good news gospel of Jesus Christ. We are part of the universal church that celebrates our calling under the inspiration of the third person of the Trinity.

“Unity” - “they were all with one accord.” (vs. 1). Confession, repentance, restoration and reconciliation prepared the early believers for the day of Pentecost. They wanted to be the N.T. Church and worked together toward unity. Psalm 133:1 - “Behold, How good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!” We are called to spiritual unity with the consistent witness that Jesus Christ is Lord. Pentecost will happen whenever the church continues the process of confession, repentance, restoration and reconciliation as a high priority for discipleship and outreach.

“Obedience” - “they were all in one place.” (vs. 1). The early believers made up their minds to obey instead of disobey Jesus’ teaching and instruction to be in Jerusalem. Their obedience led to the development of the N.T. church that Jesus would build. The Holy Spirit blesses obedience with power to be witnesses and disciples for Christ.. Jesus said, “I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.” (Matthew 16:18). Our obedience to the great commission allows the Holy Spirit to use us to help in building the Kingdom of God.

“Rewarding” - “they were all filled with the Holy Spirit.” (vs. 4). Unity and obedience leads to receiving the prize or reward of the Holy Spirit. 120 people received the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost. (Acts 1:15). Their faithfulness to be unified and obedient led to the conversion of 3,000 people on the day of Pentecost. (Acts 2:41). We are called to be disciples and servants that welcome the working of the Holy Spirit in the life of the church. The church invites the Holy Spirit to be active and alive in every heart to receive the joy of our salvation.

We must not be afraid of the Holy Spirit. The church needs to embrace the Holy Spirit as the living, third person of the trinity. Jesus said, “and when the Holy Spirit is come, he will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment.” (John 16:8). The church has been blessed by faithful servants of God in the past and in the present ministry. Good things are happening in the church because the Holy Spirit has the freedom to lead us in the spiritual ministry of discipleship and outreach. Let us grow together in Christ and move spiritually forward with the help of the Holy Spirit.

## Father's Love Steak

This Asian-style grilled skirt steak recipe uses a quick and simple marinade for juicy, flavorful meat. The Asian barbecue sauces and marinades sold at the grocery store are mostly corn syrup and salt. When you see how fast this skirt steak recipe is to make, and how delicious the marinade turns out, you won't be buying those bottled brands any longer!

Makes 6 Serving of Asian-Style Grilled Skirt Steak

Prep Time: 10 minutes

Cook Time: 10 minutes

Total Time: 20 minutes

### Ingredients:

3 tbsp brown sugar                      3 tbsp rice vinegar                      1 tbsp hot chili sauce, or other hot sauce to taste  
2 tbsp soy sauce                      1/2 orange, juiced                      3 cloves mashed garlic  
2 lbs beef skirt steak, cut in 6-inch pieces

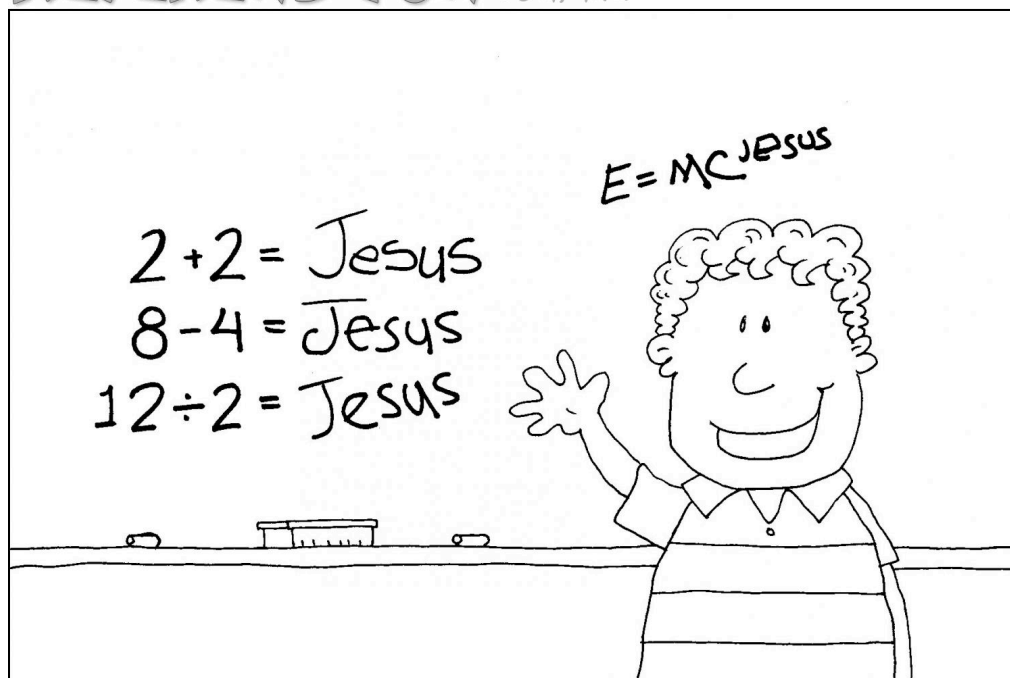
### Preparation:

In a large mixing bowl, combine all the marinade ingredients and whisk together thoroughly. Add the skirt steak, and toss in the Asian marinade until all the pieces are coated evenly. Cover the bowl and let sit, at room temperature for 15 minutes.

Remove skirt steak from marinade. Cook about 4 minutes per side for \*medium on a hot, preheated outdoor grill, or on a grill pan indoors. Let rest for 5 minutes before serving.

\*Skirt steak can be very chewy if cooked too rare. Medium will produce a tender and juicy steak. This is also a great steak if you like your beef cooked medium-well, as the meat will stay fairly moist.

## About Father's Day

Do you ever wonder how Father's Day got started? It all started because a lady wanted to thank her father for all he had done for her and her family. The first Father's Day in the United States was celebrated in Spokane Washington on June 19, 1910. It was proposed by Mrs. John B. Dodd in 1909. Her father, William Smart raised six children alone after his wife died in childbirth. He was also a civil war veteran. It wasn't until 1966 that Father's Day was declared a national holiday in the U.S. and it wasn't until 1972 that the special day happened every year.

Father's are very special, so special that they are mentioned in the Bible. Since the Bible is like an instruction manual for us, it gives us instructions on how to treat our father.

The ten commandments are rules that God gave to Moses for all of us to follow. Each commandment is very important and God gave each commandment for a reason. One of the commandments says: Honor your father and you mother, so that all may go well for you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth. What does honor mean anyway? Honor can mean many things. When we listen, obey, love, appreciate, and forgive our dad that is how we honor him. That means when he asks you to do something you should do it right away without complaining. When you show you love your dad by hugging him and telling him that you love him that's another way to honor him. You can also appreciate your dad by thanking him when he does things for you (driving you to baseball practice or music lessons, etc.). Our dads won't be perfect all the time, we all make mistakes. So we should forgive our dads when they make mistakes because God asks us too.

Some other verses in the Bible ask us to listen to our father's instruction and by doing this you will learn to have discipline and understanding. That means that when your dad gives you advice or warns you about something its important to listen. Your dad was a kid once too and know lots of stuff because they have lived longer than us. So if your dad asks you to hold his hand when you cross the street its because he knows it can be dangerous because of all the cars. It's also why sometimes dads have to say "no" to things. If your parents always let you do everything you want you would never get any sleep and eat lots of candy, but our dads know that isn't healthy for you.

The last verse we're going to talk about today says: Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord. I know that sometimes you don't always want to obey your parents but its important that you obey them because it makes God happy!

One last thing. No matter how old you get, your dad is your dad. Sometimes you might think that you can talk back to our parents or that you know more than them, but you don't. The Bible says to obey your parents always, not just when your a kid. Your parents want the best for you and know what they're talking about.

Don't forget that we also have a heavenly father that cares and loves us no matter what. So if you don't have a father around all the time (or even if you do) God is the father of all fathers. He is there when our father can't be.
